
Incentivized Losing: A Threat to the Integrity of Our Major Professional Sports






Solutions to Incentivized Losing

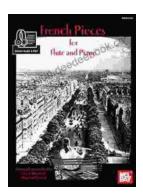
