
# Nancy Dale Army Nurse Illustrations: A Legacy of Courage and Compassion




#### **Later Life and Legacy**

After the war, Dale continued to work as an artist and a nurse. She married a fellow Army nurse and had three children. She died in 2003 at the age of 88.






Women Nurses Working in a Hospital Ward


