- 7. **Round 7:** SI st into the next ch-1 space, ch 1, *sc in the next dc, ch 6, sc in the next dc*; repeat from * to * around. (12 sc, 12 ch-6 picots)

8. **Fasten off:** Cut the yarn, leaving a tail for weaving in. Pull the tail through the last loop on the hook to secure.
